Dear Sir,

In its letter of 8 November 2018, Internet Society – France Chapter (“**ISOC**”) purports to bring to Facebook France (“**Facebook France**”), Facebook Ireland Limited (“**Facebook Ireland**”) and Facebook, Inc. (“**Facebook, Inc.**”) (collectively, the “**Facebook Entities**”)’s attention seven concerns, related to alleged violations of the General Data Protection Regulation (the “**GDPR**”). Your letter purports to formally notify the Facebook Entities to take certain measures listed in your letter within four months. It also asks the Facebook Entities to compensate any data subject who is the victim of the alleged breaches, by allocation of an indemnity in the amount of EUR 1,000 per breach and per natural person concerned.

Please be advised that Facebook, Inc. does not control the data of Facebook users residing in France, and is the wrong entity for the purposes of ISOC’s letter. Importantly, Facebook, Inc. does not operate or host the Facebook service for users residing in France, which includes the website available at <https://www.facebook.com>. Facebook, Inc. is therefore unable to address your concerns. Facebook, Inc. sends this letter solely on its own behalf, and nothing contained herein should be construed as being on behalf of any other entity

For users residing in France, the Facebook service is operated and hosted by Facebook Ireland, a company organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of Ireland. This relationship is clearly described in the Terms of Service available at www.facebook.com/terms, which constitute and define the conditions for the use of the Facebook Service and govern the relationship between each user residing in France and Facebook Ireland. Facebook Ireland is the data controller for the processing of personal data of Facebook users residing in France, as stated in the Data Policy available at <https://www.facebook.com/about/privacy/update>.

In any event, Facebook, Inc. is not authorized to act on behalf of Facebook Ireland with respect to third-party claims concerning data hosted on the Facebook

service, nor *a fortiori* is Facebook, Inc. authorized to represent Facebook Ireland in court for such claims.

Facebook, Inc. reserves all of its rights.
